Deadline 2016/03/07 - ASRM & SREI Research Grants
 The purpose of the ASRM Research Grant Program is to foster the development of innovative research, to facilitate the research endeavors of new investigators, and to provide bridge funding for projects that advance the Society's mission.

Deadline 2016/03/07 - KY Cha Award in Stem Cell Technology
 This award carries a \$20,000 grant awarded by ASRM and supported by the Asia-Pacific Biomedical Research Foundation. *The purpose of this award is to provide start-up funds to initiate an innovative research project in regenerative medicine and stem cell technology.* Funds are available for salary support, technical assistance, supplies, durable equipment or other project expenses but may not be used for indirect costs, or institutional overhead.

Deadline 2016/05/04 - Affiliated Society Prize Papers

SRI Announces New Research Awards

The Society for Reproductive Investigation (SRI) is pleased to announce the establishment of the Grant Program which offers two (2) awards to SRI Regular and In Training Members who meet the eligibility criteria. The 2016 Research Grants will provide one Research Award for Early Career Investigators and one Bridge Grant for Junior Faculty, at \$50,000 each for one year.

We first ask those individuals interested to submit a Letter of Intent (LOI) no later than September 1, 2015. Upon review of the LOI's, those selected to submit an application will receive a link to the online grant application. The deadline to submit the grant application is November 1, 2015. Grant recipients will be announced at the Annual Meeting in March 2016 and grants will be awarded July 2016.

The Letter of Intent must include the following and items 1-8 should not exceed more than 2 pages, single-spaced, in 11 or 12 point Arial, with ½-inch borders on a standard USA 8.5"x11" page size.

Grants, Prizes and Awards

The Society for Endocrinology offers a number of grants, prizes and awards which are available largely due to the funds generated by its trading company [BioScientifica Ltd.](#)

The Society's last strategic review addressed various issues connected with attracting good scientists, doctors and nurses into endocrinology and supporting them throughout their early career. Most of the grants are intended to achieve this objective.

Some are flexible to allow members to make the fullest use of them. An example is the Early Career Grants Programme, which provides grants of up to £10,000 to members for a very wide range of uses, from new equipment to finalising a project.

Several of the prizes, for example the Student Essay Prize, are intended to focus the attention of budding scientists and clinicians on endocrinology, both to ensure they learn something about the project during their studies, and to encourage them to consider specialising in endocrinology.

Industry Sponsored Funding

- Confidentiality agreement
- Drug trials
 - Phase I
 - Phase II
 - Phase III
- Device studies

Industry Sponsored Funding

- Laboratory studies – Preclinical development
- Basic Research
- Translational Research
- Animal models



Industry Sponsored Funding

- For laboratory projects
 - Protocol
 - Part of the “agreement”
 - Time frame for “delivery of results”
 - Include IACUC time
 - Experiments
 - Costs incurred (overruns)
 - Who pays for additional needs
 - Intellectual property rights
 - Be clear – investigator, institution, company



Industry Sponsored Funding

- Requires involvement of your institution and contracts/MOU/legal documentation
- Work with office of technology transfer
- Negotiate aspects of study
- Spell out details ***IN ADVANCE***
 - Protocol – usually set
 - Protocol - advice
- ***Finances – read the fine print***
