# **AE Use Case 1: Quality Data Set**

#### **Data**

- > 7 day readmit
- > EMR signs and symptoms leading to readmission were abstracted
- Data compared to the terminology database

### **Results**

1,889 Admissions

**3,335 Terms** 

**811 Unique Terms** 

66% match AE v1

75% match repeats

**Terminology Expanded AE v2** 

94% Match

6% Excluded

## **Modifications from AE Use Case 1**

- ➤ Addition of 150 Findings/Diseases added to Peds AE
- ➤ Addition of 44 Synonyms added to Peds AE
- ➤ Addition of Pediatric Medical Devices Terminology
- ➤ Addition of three new codelists from CDISC to Pediatric

- 740 Anatomical Locations
- 32 Directionality
- 7 Laterality

## **AE Use Case 2: Clinical Trial**

#### **Data**

- > Neonatal Bronchopulmonary Dysplasia Clinical Trial reported AEs
- > 145 records; 226 Individual data elements
- **≻** 68 Unique data elements

### Results

145 Records

**226 Terms** 

**68 Unique Terms** 

81% match AE v1

89% match repeats

**Terminology Expanded AE v2** 

Change: added 21 terms/findings

### Rheumatology Use Case Data Request



- ➤ 200-300 records from 2014-2015, which list reasons for visits to the pediatric rheumatology specialty clinic
  - Follow-up visits could include primary diagnoses, e.g. "JIA, came to clinic for flare"
  - Chief complaints from admissions to the hospital that were then seen by the peds rheum service ("heart failure, consult obtained for possible sarcoidosis")
