Efforts to Harmonize Pediatric Terminology

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Why are harmonized terminologies important?


Precise and easily understood communication is a critical requirement for sharing scientific results. To achieve this precision, the [data](#) and information that are collected must be described in unambiguous terms that are readily understood and agreed upon by all. The collection of such terms, a "harmonized terminology", must be accurately defined and used consistently by both data generators and data consumers. The rigorous use of controlled [terminologies](#) ensures that results from various research efforts can be communicated, combined, and analyzed as a whole, expanding their usefulness.

To foster greater accessibility and exchange of information in the Eunice Kennedy Shriver National Institute of Child Health and Human Development ([NICHD](#)) broad clinical research portfolio, the Institute has established an effort to harmonize pediatric terminology for use in current and future research studies. By harmonizing terms, the NICHD can more easily combine results from its pediatric research efforts with those of other studies and networks, to broaden scientific understanding and extend the impact of the Institute's research investment.

Utilizing a harmonized pediatric terminology involves an understanding of, and agreement to use, specific definitions for research terms and concepts. This agreement ensures that data collected from different studies, centers, or hospitals are all comparable and understandable (interoperable). The development of a harmonized terminology is a fundamental step toward enabling [interoperability](#) and [data exchange](#), which then allows aggregation and comparison of data collected at different times or by different groups, resulting in richer, more comprehensive analyses. Such a harmonized terminology requires consensus among the user community, in this case pediatric clinicians, to ensure successful implementation.

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### 3. Terminology Publication:

After the terminology has been developed, reviewed and approved by the working groups and terminology experts, it is then formatted and submitted to the NCI EVS curators for publication. NICHD Pediatric Terminology concepts are organized as a subset in the existing NCI Thesaurus hierarchy. Each concept is assigned a unique code, term definition, and synonym/ abbreviation. Each concept has one or more association relationships ("Concept in Subset") for easy retrieval from the terminology. The terminology is maintained by NCI Enterprise Vocabulary Services (EVS) and hosted on the LexEVS server. The terminology is available in MS Excel tab delimited format on the EVS ftp site (<http://evs.nci.nih.gov/ftp1/NICHD/About.html>)

The terminology version is also available for download in [OWL](#) format from the National Center for Biomedical [Ontology](#) (NCBO) [BioPortal](#) [✉](#), and is available to the broad research community, for browsing and commenting.

### 4. Terminology Implementation:

The NICHD Pediatric Terminology is being implemented in the National Children's Study (NCS) and harmonized concepts from the terminology are being used to tag metadata concepts in the [Metadata Repository](#) (MDR) for the NCS.



## Pediatric Terminology

The National Institute of Child Health and Human Development (NICHD) is working with NCI Enterprise Vocabulary Services (EVS) and numerous contributors from national and international academic, clinical, and research institutions to provide standardized terminology for coding pediatric clinical trials and other research activities.

In 2008-2010, NICHD led a [Pediatric Terminology Harmonization Initiative](#) that successfully harmonized child life stages from six primary sources and established several agreed sets of standard coding terminology. A second harmonization project integrated over 2,000 unique terms used by three neonatal research networks.

In 2013, a collaborative effort began between NICHD, NCI EVS, and outside experts in their fields to define the areas of Pediatric Adverse Events, Perinatology, Pediatric Rheumatology, Pediatric Endocrinology, Pediatric Infectious Diseases, and Pediatric Oncology.

In addition, the Pediatric Terminology project has decided to adopt as part of the Pediatric Terminology standard three Clinical Data Interchange Standards Consortium (CDISC) terminology standards for the coding of Anatomical Locations, Directionality and Laterality.

Pediatric Terminology sets are developed, updated, and published monthly through the NCI Thesaurus and EVS.



**Pediatric Terminology Files**

In early 2009, the National Institute of Child Health and Human Development ([NICHD](http://evs.nci.nih.gov/ftp1/NICHD/)) initiated an ongoing effort to establish a core library of harmonized pediatric terms, beginning with a focus on neonatal and infant examination concepts as part of a broader terminology framework. Continued efforts to harmonize pediatric terminology will support the acquisition, exchange, submission and archival of clinical research data, ultimately supporting the health and wellbeing of children.

The first four sets of terminology were the Pediatric Immunization Terminology, the Newborn Screening Terminology, Neurological Development Terminology and Pregnancy and Childbirth Terminology Subsets. In 2011 work began to establish a set of terminology for the Neonatal Research Network Terminology (NRNT) Subset. The NRNT subset contains concepts associated with neonatal research contributed by four neonatal research networks: Vermont-Oxford Network (VON), Children's Hospital Neonatal Database (CHND), the Neonatal Research Network (NRN) and NICHD. In 2013, two of six additional project areas were begun. In 2014, Pediatric Adverse Events Terminology and Perinatal Terminology were completed; the Pregnancy and Childbirth Terminology subset was subsumed by the Perinatal Terminology subset. Pediatric Rheumatology Terminology was added in May of 2015; currently under development are Pediatric Nephrology Terminology, Pediatric Endocrinology Terminology, Pediatric Infectious Disease Terminology and Pediatric Oncology Terminology. In addition, in 2015, the Pediatric Terminology adopted three subsets of terminology from the Clinical Data Interchange Standards Consortium (CDISC); this was done to leverage work already done by the CDISC group and mandated for use in clinical trial submissions by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA). Those subsets are the Anatomical Location Terminology, Directionality Terminology and Laterality Terminology subsets.

**Pediatric Terminology files** are available for download from an NCI EVS ftp site (<http://evs.nci.nih.gov/ftp1/NICHD/>) in two formats, an excel spreadsheet and a text file. A representation of the hierarchy of NICHD terms is provided as well; the terms in this hierarchy, which are restricted to NICHD terms only, do not necessarily have a direct parent-child relationship within the NCI Thesaurus (NCIt). This file is provided to aid in the visualization of the terms specific to the Pediatric Terminology project. The Pediatric Terminology file contains the entire set of terms related to all projects within the Pediatric Terminology. Additionally, individual subset files are provided. All files contain the same column headers. A Changes.txt file is published monthly and contains all changes that have been made to NICHD content in the current production version of the NCIt when compared to the most recently posted previous file. A letter preceded the data that has changed from the previous version; "A" precedes a New Term for that subset, "C" precedes any modification to a concept, "D" preceded a term that has been deleted.
