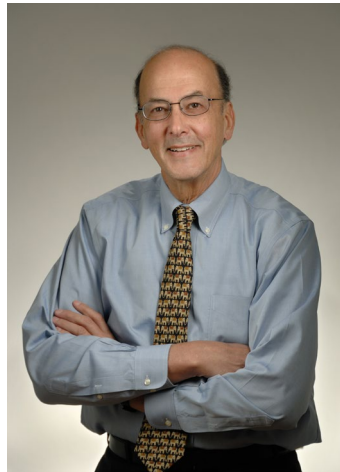

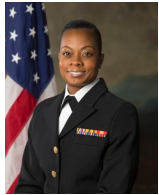

Overview



Purpose:

To better understand recent etiological and socio-ecological factors that are contributing to the increased prevalence of the double burden of malnutrition (DBM), and the implications for long-term health outcomes, among children and adolescents (ages 3 to 18 years) in low- and middle-income countries (LMICs).

DBM Definition:

The coexistence of undernutrition (i.e., micronutrient deficiencies, underweight, and childhood stunting and wasting) and overweight, obesity, and diet-related noncommunicable diseases at the individual, family, and/or community level.

Goal:

Explore evidence-based interventions, identify important research questions, and discuss policy implications toward improving nutrition and health outcomes of youth globally.

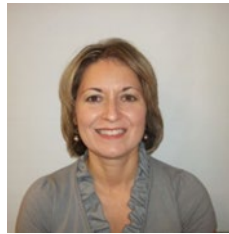
