Key Qualifications

During the past three decades as an intramural researcher at the National Institutes of Health (NIH), Dr. Simons-Morton developed research programs focused on adolescent and young adult substance use and driving, for which he was awarded the 2019 NIH Director's Award for Excellence. This research included the assessment of individual, social, and environmental influences on health behaviors, including substance use and driving. His work on teenage driving includes observational, survey, naturalistic, and experimental studies; his research on adolescent and young adult substance use, impaired driving, and related risk behaviors comprises survey and multi-level intervention trials. Dr. Simons-Morton's research has also focused on risk assessment and the development and evaluation of effective interventions.

For more than 20 years within the NICHD, Dr. Simons-Morton studied aspects of teen driving to examine the social and behavioral nature of driving for this vulnerable group and their families. As the

senior investigator of the NEXT Generation Longitudinal Study of Adolescent Health, which followed a nationally representative cohort of 10th graders for seven years, he led a team that examined the overtime patterns and influences on adolescent and young adult behaviors—including substance use, diet, physical activity, and sleep—and driving, including aggressive and distracted driving, as well as driving or riding while impaired. He has conducted and published numerous literature reviews and state of the science papers and conducted analyses of FARS data that also required combining data from the National Household Transportation Survey (Ouimet, Simons-Morton, et al., 2010). This prior research, combined with a national urgency to mitigate these issues, have led to his current research focus on impaired driving.
